

ROOM 14 GUIDELINES

Welcome to another great school year. Responsibility is the key to 5th graders success. We work with the children to help them learn to do for themselves and accept the consequences of their actions. It is important to remember supplies, to keep an organized folder, to ask for help when needed, and to complete all work on time. Most completed work is in their notebooks, folders, or workbooks. Ask your child to see them at anytime. Some graded work will be sent home periodically. These responsibilities are a year long learning process that helps the children succeed this year and in future grades.

CONTENT -

Religion - Bible, sacraments, season, saints, review vocabulary for Acre test (Assessment of Catechesis Religious Education. given by the diocese)

Math - addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, facts, whole numbers, decimals, fractions, geometry

Science - Scientific Method, measurement, electricity, matter, energy, body systems

HOMEWORK:

Homework is averaged into the over-all quarter grade for each subject. All homework must be completed (see second floor rules).

Math - practice almost every night
flash cards studied weekly

Science - written 1-2 times a week
review notes 1-2 times a week

Religion - review notes
occasionally written work

TESTS:

Tests are averaged into the over-all quarter grade. They are not weighted. Expect announced and unannounced quizzes, chapter and unit tests in Religion, Math, and Science. It is the student's responsibility to keep his/her parents informed of upcoming tests (check planner) All tests must be signed and returned after they are graded.

NOTEBOOKS:

Spiral notebooks are kept for Math, Religion, and Science. Science notebooks will be graded and averaged into the over-all quarter grade. All notebooks must be organized and neatly kept. One subject per notebook. All important information for tests are in the notebooks.

PARTICIPATION:

Many of the activities in Science depend on student participation and points will be given that will be averaged into the over-all quarter grade. Participation is not graded in Math or Religion but maybe a factor in determining borderline averages.
